Join us on Thursday, September 3rd to hear from Rear Admiral Michael Weahkee, Director of the Indian Health Service (IHS). Rear Adm. Weahkee will discuss the COVID-19 response for American Indians on and off tribal lands. Rear Adm. Michael D. Weahkee, an enrolled member of the Zuni Tribe, is the Director of the Indian Health Service, an agency within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. The IHS is the principal federal health care advocate and provider of health care services for American Indians and Alaska Natives. As director, Rear Adm. Weahkee administers a nationwide health care delivery program that is responsible for providing preventive, curative, and community health care to approximately 2.6 million American Indians and Alaska Natives in hospitals, clinics, and other settings throughout the United States.
